Stacked Deck Grant Guidelines

Program Requirements

- 1) The soft deadline for the fall grant application is June 30 with a final deadline of August 30.
- 2) All outcomes or the end of year report are due by June 30 (following year) for all grants.
- 3) Community programs must have partnerships with school systems in order to receive the grant funding. First time applicants must submit a letter of support from school administrator.
- 4) All students must complete the online pre and post surveys. The pre surveys should be given before the curriculum has been taught and post surveys after all six lessons have been taught.
- 5) The prevention coordinator will conduct a site visit every one to two years and utilize the fidelity check list when evaluating the program.
- 6) It is required that at least 30 students complete the course work to receive funding.
- 7) All of those teaching the curriculum must be trained before teaching it to students.
- 8) All grant applications must include an awareness component such as press releases, PSA's or poster contest.
- 9) All items created for awareness need to be submitted to the prevention coordinator. Signed parent consent forms are due when submitting any PSA's.
- 10) Anything printed should include the NC Problem Gambling Program logo and any poster contests or PSA's should include the NC Problem Gambling helpline number and website.

Program Recommendations

- 1) It is encouraged that all grant applications be submitted by June 30 each year.
- 2) It is recommended that sites implement the program twice a year.
- 3) New sites should make every effort to attend summer school in Wilmington, NC.
- 4) Grantees should consider participating in Problem Gambling Awareness Month (March) by sending out press releases, holding events or posting on social media.

Funding Recommendations

Acceptable uses for funding include:

- Planning and program development time for employees to offset personnel costs
- Equipment for program such as video equipment or projectors
- Software to complete PSA's
- Program supplies
- Professional development and conferences sponsored by NC Problem Gambling Program
- Travel to Stacked Deck Summer School or Sure Bet I, II or III
- Contractors with an expertise

Please note all travel must be reimbursed at the NC State rate. Also, please be aware that it can take up to eight weeks to receive funding.
